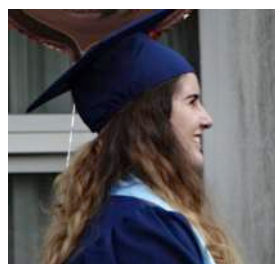
The school year is now finished and so is this newsletter issue. From September, we will use a more modern, efficient and quicker way to communicate with you:

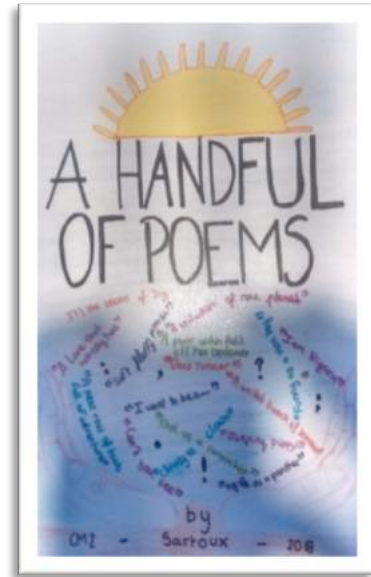
